The Board of Directors met on Tuesday with a new President and Secretary as well as two new Directors. Since Grant is new to the position and has not been on the Board of Directors in the past, much time was spent talking over procedures and helping him get up to speed on what the duties of the board amount to. Grant then presented a list of suggestions which he wanted everyone to consider and vote on at another meeting which was called for in two

Reminders:

Who puts up the score?

In a triples game, the vice of the team who <u>lost</u> the points puts up the score. In a pairs game, the vice of the team who lost the points rakes first and then puts up the score.

Who does the measuring?

There is no <u>rule</u> stating who should measure at the conclusion of an end, however it is mentioned in the "Code of Bowling Etiquette" which is in the 2011 rule book. It states the following: "When bowls need to be measured, the team or singles player that will probably or certainly concede a shot(s) should do the measuring and place identified counters together."

If the jack is knocked out of bounds (burned end), what happens next?

For many years a burned end was played over in tournaments. All the bowls were raked back and the end started all over again. In club games, most of the time the score was simply carried down and the game continued without that end being played over. In recent years, the rule has changed at the SWD level and our club has discussed this and agreed to go along with the new rule. So if the jack goes out of bounds, place it at the 2 meter mark in line with the number and the game will continue. If you are unsure of the 2 meter mark, we have a stick which is exactly 2 meters long which is kept in the equipment room for this purpose. Thanks to Max for making the 2 meter stick.
