Our first tournament of the year is coming right up on Saturday, January 19. This is the **Novice Pairs** tournament which was postponed from last year. Carol Smith Memorial:

Robin Smith, Carol's daughter, asked that I include a short reminder about the memorial "Celebration of Life" which will take place on Saturday, February 9 at 2 p.m. at the Davis Center. This will be followed by a ceremonial rolling of bowls toward the center of the Carol M. Smith Green – a "spider". Robin says "It would be cool if bowlers wore whites too." Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend this memorial for one of our most revered members. Put it on your calendar!

Annual Meeting January 5:

The annual meeting was well attended on a rain-threatening Saturday. **Treasurer Jane**Streiff gave her report and said that the club is in good shape financially with a balance of \$209,153 to our account. The special events which have been run by Bud Viard and now by Byron Hahn, brought in a record high of \$7,780 for the club. Greens maintenance and lawn mower repair, etc. were a little higher than usual this year. **Ken Gould,** who handles investments for the club, reported that he is being cautious for the time being since the market is so volatile. However, the investment fund is designed to provide about \$15,000 annually for club expenses. This income has enabled us to keep dues relatively low and to pay for such new items as lights for night bowling.

The various committees gave short recaps of the year's activities: **Max Mickey** reported that the greens are in good shape at this time, that he plans to widen the ditch to a regulation size around the Carol Smith green, and he thanked all the volunteers who helped with various chores during the year.

Sharron Adams told us that we gained 18 new members during the year, many of these came by way of our Open Days for Visitors which were held on the first Saturday of the month for most of the year. Sharron thanked her many helpers and also noted that forty members had attended Vice classes and Focused Skills games.

Marlyn Nicolas encouraged members to check the bulletin board for the bright green sheets which have tournament information and sign-up sheets. She also reported that the night bowling which takes place on Tuesday evenings starting at 5:30, generally has around two or more games, that it is very relaxed atmosphere and lots of fun for all.

Bud Viard reported on the twilight bowling which is held on Tuesday and Thursday from May through September and gives new bowlers a chance to improve their skills in a fun and "no pressure" environment. Bud also reported on the Special Olympics bocce teams who practice at our club and placed in regional competition this past year. He noted that they are very appreciative of the use of our club for their practice.

President Janet Napier gave her recap of the year which included the fact that since we are a 100% Bowls USA club, we were able to apply for and gain a grant for \$300 which will be used to advertise our Open House and our monthly open days. The members then formally voted to award a Life Membership to Stephanie Viard. Janet told us that our young member Loren Dion has been chosen to play on the U.S. team in Australia later in the year. Also, the man in charge of the New Police Department project spoke to the board members in December and

noted that they are leaning toward using the space now used by the Farmers Market instead of the Spencer Adams Park and bowling green.

Bud Viard then returned to the podium once again to present the Volunteer of the Year Award, this time to our Tournament Director, Marlyn Nicolas, for her outstanding efforts, her creativity, cheerfulness and effectiveness as a member and as Tournament Director.





President Janet then installed our new President Grant Gibson, Secretary Alice Chaffee, and Board Members Chris Trenschel and Mary Penny. New President Grant said he is looking forward to supporting the club and has some ideas for doing so. He also thanked the outgoing president for her leadership this past year.
